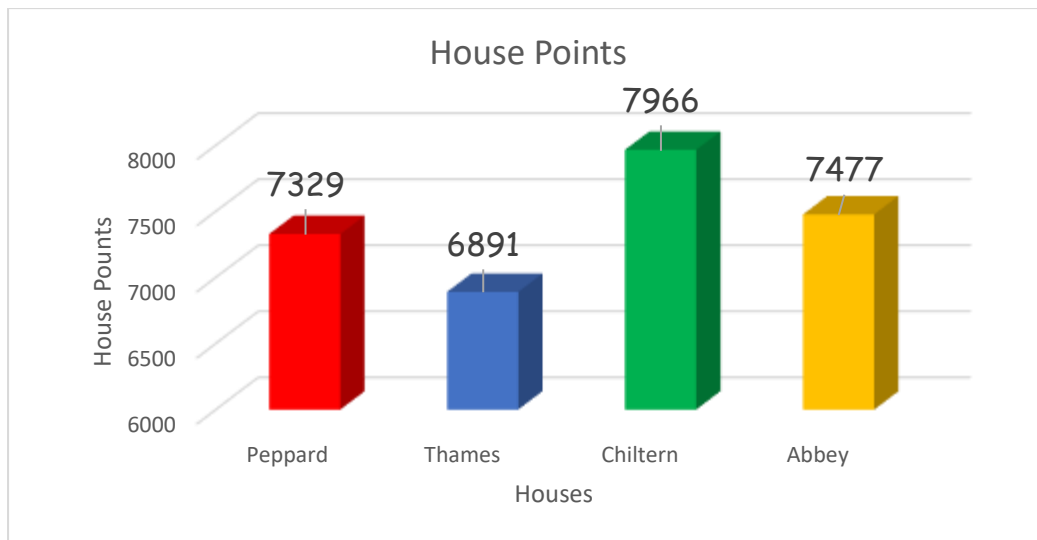
After the Easter holidays **Year 7** will be making savoury scones, **Year 8** enchiladas, and **Year 9** a seasonal product of their choice.
