Dear Parent/Guardian

I hope everyone is well and finding time to get some exercise and time away from screens.

We have continued our focus on live lessons and live learning as much as possible and continue to be impressed by the fortitude of the students who are keeping a very positive approach to their learning. Now we have settled into our rhythm we are printing a behaviour log twice a week focused on low engagement or non-engagement of lessons and staff will be following this up with regular phone calls on how we can best the support the students to get back on course. The subject of students on cameras in lessons has come up a lot on Twitter and in the educational press as well in an e-mail I received from a parent. Our preference is that all students, if possible, are on camera to begin the lesson. The reason for this is a quick safeguarding triage and also at this time of social isolation a quick 'hello' and 'how are you?' which I know is highly appreciated by both staff and students. However, I realise it isn't possible for everyone to be on camera so we can only encourage rather enforce this but I hope everyone is clear on why we are doing this.

During our routinely Lateral Flow Test on site this week, a student has tested positive. We immediately contacted Public Health England and followed their guidance to ensure that only a small number of students needed to self-isolate as a result of this event. Fingers crossed we are now in the final weeks of the pandemic as the vaccine is rolled out but it is very important we remain vigilant and keep up our positive hygiene and social distancing routines when are on the school site.

A huge thank you to parents and members of our wider local community who have donated to our Book Drive initiative launched last week. It has been lovely reading the notes added to orders, and a particular thanks for the box of Maltesers that snuck into one order – they were very gratefully received! I know a number of you have shared the initiative in your own networks too, thank you.

Another of our extra opportunities kicked off this week with our Gold and Silver clubs for Higher Ability pupils. I had great fun watching the Year 7 and 8s debate through the chat function the merits of Communism and Capitalism in my session on 'What is Economics?'. It is clear that we have some future leaders in our school, judging by the sparky sharp comments that they were posting in response to my questions.
