As we reach the end of a long term it is worth reflecting that we began with an INSET day on January 4<sup>th</sup> that was capped by a speech from Boris Johnson announcing a new lockdown. From there we switched to remote learning on January 5<sup>th</sup> and launched our key worker and vulnerable student pop up school. Alongside this we began staff Covid testing and then student onsite testing. Students returned to school from March 8th for onsite lessons with three rounds of Lateral Flow tests around this date. Since then we have had four weeks of lessons and learning with an attendance rate of approximately 95% (which is almost 10% above the national average), with Year 11s working hard on their assessment work in preparation for their final grades and the rest of the school settling down nicely into learning routines. It has been quite a term!

Thank you so much for all your support and kind feedback for our effort and industry in keeping the school functioning as much as possible during Lockdown and beyond. I know staff have felt motivated by your kind words during a difficult period for everyone across the country.
