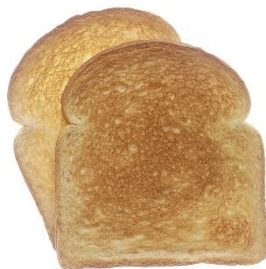
Word of the Week

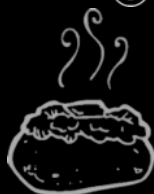

Exciting Opportunity – Job role – Sonning Common Youth Leader:

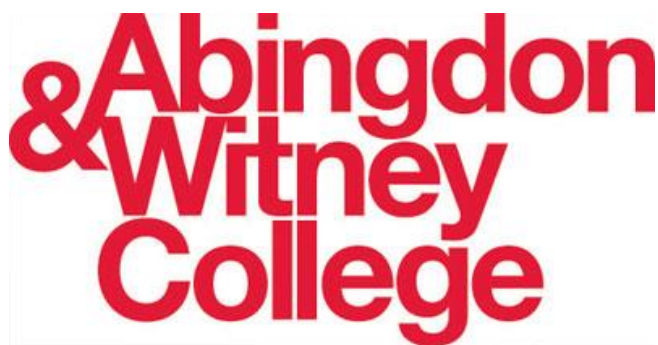
Sonning Common Youth Club are looking for motivated and enthusiastic Youth Leaders to join the team at our fun and busy club for young people aged 10-16.
