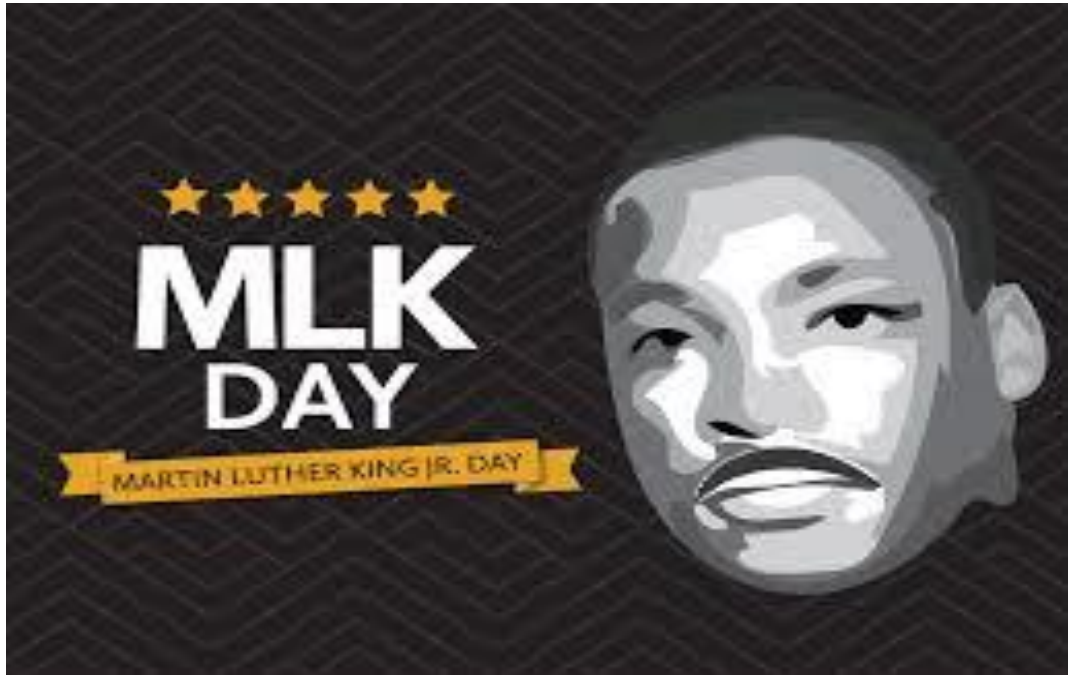

The Addams Family Show is due to take place on Wednesday 16 February & Thursday 17 February.

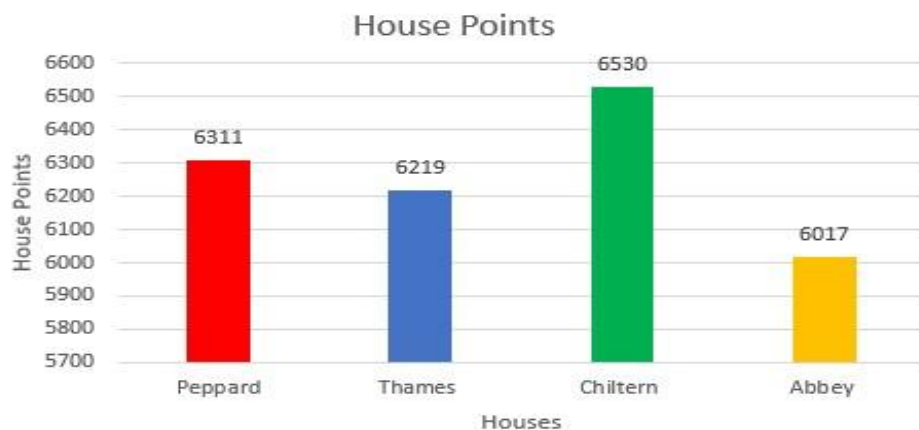
