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
Dear Parent/Guardian

It has been another good week and I have particularly enjoyed leading assemblies to all the students and being in lots of lessons as part of our School Review 2.

Assembly

My assembly has been on new beginnings and positive habits, and I have shared with the students some points from the book 'Atomic Habits' by James Clear that I have been reading recently. I hope the students have been listening and making small positive adjustments and doing more of the things that work well for them. I shared the following list of effective habits that can help the students.

- Packing your bag, the night before school
- Getting a good night's sleep
- · Laying the correct uniform out before you go to bed
- Ensuring you eat a healthy breakfast
- Having the SMHW app on your phone and enabling notifications
- Staying hydrated with water or low sugar drinks
- Doing your homework, the night it is set
- Leaving your phone in a different room while you do your homework
- Attending homework club once a week
- Keeping your work neat, highlighting titles, reviewing your work each week to make sure you understand everything.



School Review 2

My lessons visits have also been positive, and I have been particularly impressed with the focus of students in lessons this was corroborated on a parental tour this week. The visiting parent was lavish in her praise of the appearance and positive working attitude of the students in comparison to her current local secondary school. Our focus in the School Review has been on whether the students with SEN are being supported and I am pleased to report I have seen some very strong practice. These have included: seating arrangements deliberately done to provide support, reduced text extracts, sentence starters, clear modelling of best practice, TAs well deployed, deliberate overlearning of certain topics to ensure fluency, keywords always on the board, constant checking for understanding, differentiated questioning for SEND students, the curriculum adjusted for certain sets to name but a few!!

Mrs Clarke, our SENCO, has been doing Pupil Pursuits in various lessons and Alison Walker, our Director of Inclusion, will be talking to SEND students in panels today to get their viewpoint. When all this information is triangulated and assembled, we should have a more complete picture of this aspect of our provision, but I hope you can see how hard we are working to ensure we have a complete picture of classroom practice.

School Canteen

Since last week our new Head of Kitchen, Michelle Boden has been in charge. If your son or daughter has not been a regular user of our canteen, I would ask that they give it another go. Michelle's food is excellent and there is some real love and care being applied. This week I
