Staying Safe Presentations

This week, we have had visitors working with the students on personal safety and awareness. The focus was on the issue of County Lines gangs and how skilfully they prey on younger children, often without them being aware until it is too late. On Friday, Year 7, 8 and 9 have had a presentation and workshops from a company called Advanced Tactical Resources and this has been focused on how to spot and stay clear of situations and individuals posing a risk to young people. This has been paid for by CESA in the wake of the Ollie Stephens murder last January.

They have only 19 school days left from Monday, and we want to make sure they really smash it. Linked to this, I was proud to talk about our Easter School for our students. Parent Forum, Feedback and Uniform

I am grateful to the parents that attended and the positive affirmation of our work along with some great ideas and tweaks that we could look at.
