Etiquette


The unwritten rules concerning players behaviour e.g. the football teams showed good etiquette by shaking hands after the match.



Detention systems- a reminder

- Departmental detentions are given if a student misses a homework or has poor conduct in a lesson. These take place on Monday-Thursday
- Blue slip detentions are set for a lack of equipment, incorrect uniform. These take place in the AV at break
- Friday lunch detentions are led by SLT and are for poor punctuality (3 or more lates in the week), missing break detentions or a particular behaviour incident
- Anyone missing any of these detentions or behaving poorly in a detention will be set a Wednesday after school detention which lasts for one hour. Failure to attend this results in a Friday after school detention with SLT until 4.30pm. After school detentions may also be set for one off incidents of poor behaviour



Mobile Phones

- Just a reminder phones are not permitted to be used by students at MECE this is for safeguarding reasons, but also because of the distraction they cause
- If they are seen out they will be confiscated and will be returned at the end of the day. Students will receive a breaktime detention as a sanction
- On the third occasion parents will be informed and the phone will only be returned to them when they come and get the phone.
- If students refuse to hand over their phone this becomes defiance which will result in a more serious sanction (usually the removal from lessons)
