The Queen

The week has been slightly sombre and we have ended with a Commemorative Service for the Queen this afternoon. We have celebrated the life of Elizabeth, the length of her reign and her commitment to service.

We felt it was important to hold the service and to give our own MECE farewell to the Queen. In addition, we wanted to ensure our students understood the events of the last week and over the next weekend.

Those of you who follow us on Twitter may have noticed that we haven't posted this week. This isn't because we haven't wanted to post but rather, we have been observing an agreement between most schools to mute their social media posts during this period of national mourning.

Assembly

This week Mrs Benham has been leading the morning assembly for all year groups. The assembly has focused on a range of topics including safeguarding processes within the school, relationships and messaging to ensure how students know how to keep safe.

Headteacher's Challenge

I had the pleasure of marking the Year 7 Headteacher's Challenge on Monday. These are pieces of work submitted by the students when they arrive with us and they are intended for the tutors to use as introductory personal information. Routines and learning

It has been brilliant to be out and about each day and see how well the students have settled into their new classes and are meeting our high expectations. Listening to so many of my staff say what a great day they've had and how focused the students have been is a real pleasure. Unfortunately, despite clear rules, written expectations and explicit reminders one or two students have decided to ignore these expectations, however we have worked hard through

a combination of sanctions and support to get the majority of these students back on track this week.

Just a reminder that the school is closed on Monday for the Queen's funeral, but we will be back open as normal on Tuesday.

Next week

We are looking forward to welcoming Year 7 parents on Thursday at 6pm for our Parent Welcome meeting. A communication has been sent out and for those who haven't yet responded can I remind you to click on the link.

Our push on reading continues as we also have the author of 'Running on the Roof of the World', our Year 7 Summer reading book, coming in to hold a workshop with Year 7. This will be supported by our regular 'Drop Everything and Read' slot on Monday 26 September.

In addition, we will be welcoming prospective parents to the school on Tuesday and Thursday. We have over 50 families coming in to see the school for these two mornings with more planned for early October. Furthermore, on Tuesday 27 September we have our annual Open Evening and it is a wonderful MECE family occasion with students and all our staff putting the school on show.
