Welcome Back!

Firstly, can I warmly welcome you to the academic year 2022-2023. We are looking forward to what we (and I'm sure all of you) hope is a year of normality regarding Covid and any other disruptive factors.

The last year has been a fantastic twelve months for the school and we hope to maintain that momentum of great results, a growing roll, and high expectations.

This week has been a strong start overall and I have walked the school on a number of occasions. I have been particularly pleased to see tutor times being used so productively with Year 10 and 11 engaged in Science, Maths and English revision activities, alongside Key Stage Three participating in tutor reading. In addition, our extra lessons programme began on Thursday with Mrs Giordan delivering a Period 6 for the Higher-Level Mathematicians.

Year 7 and 11 - Day 1

We had a brilliant first day on Monday for our new Year 7s and our returning Year 11s. I held assemblies with both year groups laying down our expectations and discussing our values alongside a presentation on the positive journey of the school. In addition, both year groups had ice breakers and a lovely community lunch which was shared with tutors. I really appreciated the chance to sit down with both year groups and meet the students, discuss their summers, see how their days had gone how they were feeling about the weeks ahead. Year 11 finished the day with a talk from motivational speaker and Paralympian, Andy Lewis, about his journey from athlete to amputee and on into the world of Paralympic triathlons, culminating in a gold medal at Rio in 2016.

Sleep and routines

As all the school has returned it has been interesting to observe how tired many of the students are. I would ask that as parents you work hard on getting the students back into a regular night time routine, a sensible bedtime and a distraction free bedroom (with the phone left elsewhere in the house). Poor sleep can be so corrosive to strong academic performance and we all need to work together to support good sleep patterns. Good sleep also links closely to attendance with students' health and immune systems often affected by poor sleep hence I hope this year we can get back to the strong attendance habits that we had in school before the pandemic of over 95% attending each day.



Results Day

GCSE Results day on 25 August seems a long time ago but was such a lovely occasion and I attach a photo of our happy students. The data supports the positivity of the day with our 4+ pass rate (a C grade in old money!) increasing from 49% in 2019 to 73% in 2022. This 24% increase far outstrips the 6% growth that was the average across the country. Some of our outstanding performers included:

The breadth of destinations is a strong indication of the robust careers advice for the students in ensuring they understand their possible destinations after Maiden Erlegh Chiltern Edge.
