#### **Behaviour**

I had the unfortunate experience of suspending some students this week. Headteachers don't do this without due consideration, but these suspensions were necessary. In addition, I have had a number of students out of lessons on Friday working in silence on an extended day. Please can I ask that you discuss with your sons and daughters two clear messages. Firstly, please do not bring petty arguments and disagreements from outside of school into school. School is a place to learn and is a formal environment and therefore anyone wishing to behave in an unsafe manner that endangers other students and staff can expect to be sanctioned. In addition, please can you discuss with your son or daughter that we won't accept students disrespecting teachers, challenging their word or talking over their instructions. On Thursday almost 300 students received house points for a range of different things and 28 students received negative points for a range of behavioural indiscretions, mostly talking out of turn. On Tuesday night over 100 students helped at Open Evening and dazzled and shone and showed off our school with pride. These students make up the vast majority of our wonderful school and we are determined that these students will have the chance to learn, progress and prosper without interruption.
