JENNY PEARSON



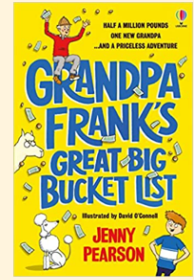

- Last year, more than 500,000 children were registered to take part in the event

How do I take part:

- Come to the sports hall changing rooms at lunchtime on a **Tuesday, Wednesday** or **Thursday** and get changed into PE kit or you can walk in school uniform
- Mr. Hunter will record the distance you complete each lunchtime up until you have completed 2.6miles – if you want to do more that is also fine!
- 10 house points for every student who completes 2.6miles, receive a TCS Mini London Marathon Pin Badge and a certificate.
