# MECE Behaviour and expectations

- Uniform- be absolutely spot on please

- Tools for Learning- ensure you get it sorted before school begins, increase your learning time!
- Line up, meet and greet the teacher and arrive in orderly fashion into your lesson
- Do Now –quiet working and settle into the lesson
- No Hands Up questioning no shouting out, let the teacher run the lesson
- Questioning will involve as many students as possible to check for understanding so the teacher knows they can
  move on
- Quiet for all teacher explanations- keep focused on their movements and words
- Follow MECE presentation standards- title, underlining, drawings in pencil, ruled lines for tables and diagrams-PRIDE! Your book is your revision guide
- Quiet work for all book tasks your brain needs the space to focus, think analyse and explain
- Stay in your seat unless you are have been given permission to move by the teacher
- Manners, manners, manners... take the time to say thank you, hold doors open and show respect to all members of the community
- One way system- please move around the outside of the school in a clockwise direction

## Homework expectations

**EEF:** secondary students homework can improve progress by 5 months.

Homework that is linked to classroom work tends to be more effective. In particular, studies that included feedback on homework had higher impacts on learning.

#### **Purpose**

- Homework will depend greatly on the subject but the principles remain the same:
- Set weekly on BromCom. 1 hr per subject.
- Homework should consolidate and embed learning
- Either by practicing (a skill or retrieval of knowledge)
- Or by pre-reading or reading/exploring further Or by applying new knowledge/skills in a different context

We would encourage your support in ensuring the safety of your children travelling to and from school by reminding them to remain seated and not put themselves, or anyone else, at risk.


The 25 will additionally leave school at 4.15 to enable attendance at after school clubs

# Teaching and Learning at MECE




#### How to make the most out of learning

Our working memory is very limited!

We can only retain a few bits of information at a time.

So?




**Students can help themselves** by paying attention to the right things, writing things down clearly in their exercise books, rehearsing and retrieving information to embed it in their long-term memory.

**Teachers can help** by making instructions clear, offering lots of opportunity for retrieval practice.

**Parents can help by** helping students organise themselves (their homework, their school bags, their time) to reduce working-memory-overload, help create a quiet space to work to reduce distracting stimuli, help 'test' their children to practice retrieval.

# Top tips for home learning success

- Find somewhere quiet to work
- Free yourself from distractions: TV, phones, friends, social media etc
- If you find music helps you focus, choose music WITHOUT lyrics!

- Little and often is better than cramming for hours.
- Highlighters can help categorise your note-making, highlighting itself is not a strategy for learning.

General good practice for learning: eat a healthy diet, get a good night's sleep and exercise regularly, all of these reduce stress.



# Organisation

- The more organised you are, the less you are relying on your working memory to remind you of things!
  - Use your planner fully to help you stay organised
  - Check Bromcom EVERY day
  - Pack your bag the night before
  - Work somewhere quiet and free from distractions
  - Minimise wasted time




# Improving your literacy skills
