Pastoral Team Changes for the Next Academic Year

As we approach the end of the academic year, I am writing to inform you of some important changes to our pastoral team for the next academic year. These changes have been made to strengthen the support we provide for all our students and ensure the continued wellbeing and success of every child at Maiden Erlegh Chiltern Edge.

From September 2025, the pastoral team will be structured as follows:

- **Miss Haycock will become Head of Year for Years 7 and 8**
- **Miss Jackson will become Head of Year for Years 9 and 10**
- **Mr Mount will become Head of Year for Year 11**

These adjustments have been necessary following the promotion of Miss Cheeseman, who we are delighted to congratulate on her appointment to the Senior Leadership Team.

As you can see for your child, there are no changes to structure. However, due to the number of students on roll in year 7 currently, we have made the decision to reduce the number of classes for some subjects to two affective from Tuesday 1st July. Please note, core subjects and tutor time will remain as 3 groups. The rationale for this is to assess student dynamics before the summer holidays and any adjustments that need to be made can be done so for the start of the new academic year. Year 7 students will receive new timetables during an assembly on Monday with Miss Bliss and Miss Haycock.

In addition to the pastoral leads, we are pleased to introduce a new system of Senior Leadership Team (SLT) links to year groups, designed to further strengthen the support structure around each year group. These links will be:

- **Miss Cheeseman – Years 7 and 8**
- **Mr Clark – Year 9**
- **Mrs Hills – Year 10**
- **Miss Bliss – Year 11**

Each SLT link will work closely with the Heads of Year to ensure that the academic progress, behaviour, and wellbeing of students are monitored and supported effectively.
