Final Communication

With GCSE exams now complete, I wanted to share a final communication regarding end of school & results arrangements.

GCSE Results

GCSE results day this year will be on 20 August 2026 and we are planning to offer students two methods of collection for results this year:

1. Collection from school – Students who opt for this option will be able to collect their results in person from the school site, between 10.00am and 11.30am. **We will not release results to third parties under any circumstances**
2. Email – Students unable to attend results collection on the 20th August can request they are emailed to them. This will take place from 10am on 20 August and a hard copy of the results will be posted that day. These emails will be sent to the student's school email address unless the student has already sent a signed letter/email stating they wish an alternative address to be used.

We may need to contact students regarding their results by post, **please ensure that your current address is the one that we hold on file**. This can be checked via the MCAS app.

Appeals Process

Following Results Day in August students can opt to view their papers and/or conduct a review of the marking. There are costs associated with the latter of these processes – details of which will be in the results envelope on Results Day. Students should be aware that if they enter into the appeals process, their **grade could go down, up or stay the same**. Prom – Thursday 02 July

We are getting excited for the upcoming Prom taking place at Badgemore Golf Club (Henley-on-Thames) on Thursday 02 July.

Students should arrive from 6.30pm with entry to the venue from 7pm. There is a lovely big car park where parents and friends can wait and welcome Y11 students arriving. We keep our fingers crossed for a warm, sunny July evening.

The Prom is a school event and as such no students will not be allowed to enter with cigarettes or vapes. Alcohol and other illegal substances are also prohibited. Any student found with these items will be removed and parents will be called to pick them up.

Students should be collected by 11pm.

Uniform

With the completion of the examinations, we know that many families might be in a position and willing to donate school uniform back to the school to be added to our “spares” that we lend to students. We also liaise with CESA who can sell pre-loved uniform to other MECE families. We are particularly keen for donations of blazers, PE Kit, skirts and trousers. If you would be willing to donate your son/daughter’s uniform then this can be dropped at school reception between 8am-4pm.

Lockers

If your son/daughter had a locker this year, please can they arrange for it to be emptied before the end of term. Anything left in lockers will be destroyed.

Revision Guides / Study Aids / Text Books

We also willingly accept copies of revision guides / text books and other study aids that may no longer be of use. These are often re-purposed within departments or the school library to support next year’s GCSE students. Again, these can be dropped into reception between 8am-4pm.

Post-16 Study / Apprenticeship

Any student who has not yet secured their place for Post-16 study or an Apprenticeship can still access support from school over the remainder of the school year. They should contact Mr Mount in the first instance who can coordinate members of the team to help



with applications. Where at all possible we encourage students to have both a first and second choice option in place ahead of results day. Should it be required there will be additional access to further support on GCSE Results day.
