Message from Richard Hawthorne Acting Head of School

The group were given a presentation by Helen Barnett in the historic surroundings of The King's Arms Barn. Helen's talk was very informative and certainly got across the message that Henley, a town of 10 000 people, punches well above its weight as far as tourism is concerned. Afterwards, the group carried out a land use transect in the town centre and interviewed both locals and tourists, many of whom were attending the Literary Festival.

Read, say, look, cover, check; post-it notes, lists of words, put words in sentences. There are many methods. The key is to learn regularly. It is great too if students can be tested by someone at home.

One great online app for vocabulary learning is: Quizlet https://quizlet.com

All students studying French or German should have created a logon to quizlet by now so they can access sets of words and phrases recently studied (or for flipped learning). Anyone can make their own revision sets using this too. Students should join their class be logged on every time they use it. Links have been given on SMHW. Please note: names should be recognisable but not necessarily their first and last name. Many students are already making use of this app and we can see who has logged in and who has the top scores. Some other subjects make use of this too.

How can I help my child at home?

There are three very important ways you can help your child with their studies:

- 1. Encourage them to read as much as possible. Reading helps develop vocabulary and improve spelling and grammar. It also means that they are more confident across the whole curriculum.
- 2. Encourage them to organise their time so they complete their homework on time and to the best of their ability.
- 3. Ask them about what they are learning about in different subjects.

PE Review

It's been a very busy, but exciting start to the academic year for the PE department. We have, in total, had 32 fixtures across all year groups, in three different sports this term.


Year 7 colour theory, Year 8 food paintings, Year 9 study of Samantha Bryan and GCSE observational painting.

- Y10 work experience has been launched in conjunction with our partner OXLEP.


It is important that extra-curricular activities and trips are run voluntarily by staff and it is exceptional that such an offer is possible in a school like MECE. Thank you to everyone involved.
